ONLINB REGISTRATION

Only ATPE presidents can certify delegates to vote in the House of Delegates (HOD). Ask your local unit president to certify you as a voting or alternate delegate by March 4, 2009, so you can participate in the HOD. Only certified delegates are allowed to vote.

If you are only interested in attending as a voting delegate and will not be participating in other convention activities, ask your local unit president to certify you as a voting delegate for HOD only—your registration will be free! (HOD-only registrants who wish to visit the Exhibit Hall must pay a \$15 fee, which includes entrance for both Thursday and Friday.) If you would like to attend the convention as a nonvoting member, ask your president to register you as a nonvoting attendee so you may observe the HOD and participate in other convention activities.

Region presidents must certify region officers, including the region's director. The ATPE State Bylaws prohibit regions from sending alternates.

REGISTRATION FEES

The registration fee for professional, associate, retired and public ATPE members is \$95 (\$105 after March 4). College student and teacher-trainee members can attend the convention for free. HOD-only registrants and nonmember guests may purchase Exhibit Hall passes for \$15 (includes entrance for both Thursday and Friday).

The registration fee does not include tickets to the Awards Banquet (\$35 for the first ticket and \$45 per additional ticket) or Friday and Saturday boxed lunches (\$15 each).

Some local units assist with their attendees' expenses; check with your local unit officers to find out what kind of assistance is available.


